In design echoes the Lone Gate Bridge which was name after Chilchiyuy [The Lions], two peaks that the Squamish people call the "Sasters". Between the paddles is a Coase Salish image of a Frundersird head which is a Super Network and It is a Coase with two paddles up to signify West Vancouver and Squamish Nation pulling together and straining mutual respect, and to build a foundation for the future generations to come The loundation is representation of a worsh based and medicinal garden inside it. This can metaphorically have the idea of wealth, growth, healing and nurturing as one.




Melting Column


Dialogue

The concrete rooves subtlety suggest funerary beds while the small water pools reflect the sky above. The concrete, granite and rough stone palette of materials seem to emerge from the ground and are a complimentary background to the moss, ferns and coniferous trees on the site.






